Satire The Other Type of Humour

Satire is a form in <u>art</u> or <u>writing</u> which ridicules either a person, <u>government</u>, or an institution, often through the use of <u>humour</u>.

Satire can either be in <u>paintings</u>, <u>plays</u>, <u>books</u>, <u>songs</u>, <u>TV</u> or <u>movies</u>. It also is used to <u>stereotype</u> people.

Satire was used long ago. It is a <u>Latin</u> word, though the plays of <u>Aristophanes</u> are often called satirical. Satire was widely known in <u>Elizabethan</u> times.

Satire often points out ironic or bad things that powerful people are doing. Its adjective is **satirical**.
