### 1. Art Cyclopedia (The Ultimate Guide to Art Online)

Easily locate information by artist name, subject, nationality or art movement. Click on the Baroque Art link for a comprehensive list of Baroque artists arranged chronologically with corresponding dates and nationalities. Each entry has a short artist biography with online information organized into headings such as image archives, media links, and a comprehensive list of galleries featuring the artist's work. An amazing site!

### 2. The Metropolitan Museum of Art (MET) – Heilbrunn Timeline of Art History

A website organized by Christopher L.C.E. Witcombe, Art History professor. Most of the links also connect to the MET, Wiki Paintings and Wikimedia Commons. However, the page does present a comprehensive, organized list and may supplement the above resources.

**School District Databases** – Ask the Library for the password access information

Enter via [www.wgsslibrary.ca](http://www.wgsslibrary.ca) (link to databases on homepage)

Visit **Gale Databases - Power Search**. Enter a search term (Rubens, Peter Paul) and the database will not only search for all articles related to this topic but will also organize them in a visual form using the **TopicFinder** feature. You can select a subtopic and the database will return the top hits in a side-bar for you to easily access.

Visit the **EBSCO Databases - EBSCOHost** provides access to vetted resources. Enter the search terms as fully as possible, remembering that you can manipulate the search parameters such as: relevance, subject, source, and dates or even use the advanced search option to enter additional search terms.

**EBSCO Databases - History Reference Center** is another collected of resources such as magazines, academic journals, reference sources, etc. which you can easily search using the Basic or Advanced search features.
